Welcome to Summer Convention!

So, we must listen very carefully to the truth we have heard, or we may drift away from it. Hebrews 2:1

These will be held in the auditorium from **2:30 – 4:00pm** (Thursday, Friday, Saturday). A highlight this summer will be the formal opening of the new accommodation building on Sunday following the afternoon session. Afternoon tea will be served in the new dining room – feel free to come and bring your friends to this historic occasion.

The cost of running a Convention event like this is considerable. We are grateful for people financially and prayerfully supporting us through the offerings and other donations. If people who attend the whole Convention gave \$90 we would cover our budget of \$45,000. Alternatively, it costs about \$6.50 per session.

Of most importance is the morning **Prayer Meeting** – join us at 8.30am (9:00am Sunday) in the prayer room in the new building at the rear of the stage (entrance via the new building).

May we leave this Convention more encouraged to live 'with purpose for the sake of Christ and His Kingdom'.

PRAYER

Prayer meetings will be held in the 'new' back stage room (follow the signs), each day at **8:30am (9am** Sunday). You are encouraged to attend so that together we can seek the blessing of the Lord upon the ministry of the Word and all that is done in His name.

CRÈCHE

During the daytime main sessions, crèche facilities are provided in the playcentre just beyond the kiosk refreshment and picnic area. The crèche is for children and toddlers up to 4 years old. **Parents using this facility will be rostered on to help and need to show their WCC.** Please note that outside meeting times the crèche equipment may be used with adult supervision. **Crèche check-in is outside the crèche area.**

YOUNG ADULTS

A Young Adult (18+) program will be held in Masters Manor after the end of the evening session.

GENERAL INFORMATION

SHUTTLE BUS

A shuttle bus service between Belgrave station and the Convention is available. Generally this service operates half an hour before main sessions and after as required. Please call the office (9752 6855) at least 10mins before arrival at the Belgrave Station.

SPEED LIMIT

The maximum driving speed on Convention Ave and the Convention property is **no more than 10 kph.** Particular care is to be exercised in the camping areas.

PARKING

Day Visitors – Parking is available on the Convention grounds and/or the Convention Lodge. To maintain good relations with the neighbours DO NOT park in the street outside Convention property.

Staying On-Site – If you have a 2nd car do not park it in the Day Visitor Car Park. Park at the Convention Lodge car park (*see map – Lockwood Road*).

DISABLED ACCESS

Vehicle access for disabled drop-off is located next to the auditorium on the left of Convention Avenue for drivers with disabled passengers. **This is not a parking space**, but cars can be parked across the road.







Chris Sinkinson

Chris originally studied Philosophy and English before going on to complete an MA and PhD in Theology. He has been involved in Christian ministry with UCCF and as a Church pastor. He was Senior Pastor of Alderholt Chapel in Dorset for over ten years. Chris tutors and lectures at Moorlands College and regularly leads student tours to

Israel. Chris writes a monthly column for Evangelicals Now and has authored a number of books. He has a great interest in archaeology and the Bible and has been involved in the Bethsaida Excavations Project in the Galilee. Chris is married to Ros, herself a Youth and Community worker in a local church. They have two children and a West Highland Terrier.



Gillian Asquith

Gillian grew up in England and studied Oriental Studies at the University of Oxford. She has tutored at Ridley College, taught at the Presbyterian Theological College and lectured in Early Christianity at the Australian Catholic University (ACU). Gillian teaches biblical studies at Melbourne School of Theology (MST) and has developed

MST's archaeology study tour. She regularly takes students on digs to Israel and is at her happiest when hot and dirty with a trowel in her hand. Gillian is a member of the Steering Committee for the Society of Biblical Literature's Biblical Lexicography program unit and vice-chair of the Board of Summer Institute of Linguistics Australia. Gillian regularly preaches at churches and Conferences in Victoria and interstate.



Michael Raiter

Michael is from Liverpool, England and raised in New South Wales. He began his career as a high school teacher in Sydney and Pakistan. After studying at Moore Theological College he returned to Pakistan to teach at the Zarephath Bible Institute. He joined the faculty at Moore College as head of the Department of Missions. From 2006–2011 Michael was

Principal of the Bible College of Victoria (now the Melbourne School of Theology). In 2012, Michael launched the Centre for Biblical Preaching, an independent specialist training institute for preachers hosted by St James Old Cathedral, Melbourne West, where he is also appointed to the staff and takes about a quarter of the preaching. The Centre was created in active partnership with CMS Australia. He is the author of a number of books, including *Stirrings of the Soul; Shadows of the Cross*, and *I Saw a Lamb*. Michael is married to Sarah.



THE VISION

We are a ministry and see major property development as a means to an end, although they are major projects. However, we have seen the blessing that our facilities have provided over our history. In the early days the facilities were quite basic but the improvements in recent times have enabled enhanced ministry opportunities both for us and an increasing number of others. Secular facilities are now less available to Christians so our property is more vital than ever.

THE JOURNEY

From a Property Master Plan in 2000 to an upgraded auditorium in 2003, then a foyer, Rec Hall, meeting rooms and upgrades of the Small Hall, camping amenities blocks and other facilities it has been quite a journey. The latest dining and accommodation development, The Hope Centre, has been the most challenging with its huge financial commitment, permit issues and construction of such a large building partly during the Covid period.

A massive thanks to our Project Manager, Tony Evans, the Property Committee and a group of volunteers who have supported the trades that have constructed the building.











THE PRESENT

This is written in anticipation that the building is currently occupied and meals are being served in the dining room. A great achievement.

Including construction costs of \$10.6 million the total cost including all preliminary expenses furnishings etc is almost \$12 million, with just over half covered by donations to this project. We are keen to reduce the debt by donations, bequests and the operations of the building. Interest free loans placed in an offset account will reduce interest and enable quicker repayments. God has provided through his people. Thanks.

We stand at the beginning of opportunity. Opportunity to grow convention ministry – please invite your friends, enquire about how you can be part of a committee, be a volunteer, and pray for this future.


MISSION STANDS – SUMMER CONVENTION 23/24
