

SITUATION.

UPWEY is situated 24 miles from Melbourne, and is the first station on the narrow gauge line from Upper Ferntree Gully to Gembrook. It is a pretty township, a mile and a half from Ferntree Gully, nestling at the foot of the Dandenongs, and has delightful walks, together with opportunities for splendid mountain climbing for the young people.

MEETINGS.

The Convention meetings are held in a large marquee on the Convention ground, adjoining the Upwey Union Church, and will begin on Christmas Eve with a Prayer Meeting at 8 p.m.



EARLY MORNING PRAYER MEETINGS.—There will be early prayer meetings every morning at 7 o'clock, including Sunday, commencing on Christmas morning.

MORNING BIBLE READINGS.—An important alteration is made this year. The first Bible Reading will be at 10 a.m. daily—Sunday excepted—to be followed by a second session, commencing shortly after 11 o'clock.

This alteration has been determined upon to allow, with three exceptions, for the **afternoons to be free.**

BOXING DAY (Thursday, December 26).—Meeting in Marquee.

SATURDAY, December 28.—Missionary Picnic.

NEW YEAR'S DAY.—Melbourne Bible Institute Meeting.

TRANSPORT.

RAILWAY SERVICE.—There is a splendid railway service, with change at Upper Ferntree Gully. **Holiday Excursion Fares to Upwey:** First return, 4/2; second return, 3/3. **Day Single:** First, 2/6; second, 1/11. Many trains run to Upper Ferntree Gully only, for which the fares are, of course, lower, and these can be used with the aid of a motor from the Gully Station to Upwey; fare, 4d.

MOTOR SERVICE.—There is also a service of motors from the city to Belgrave (passing through Upwey). Fares: 4/ single, 6/ day return.

ACCOMMODATION.

FURNISHED HOUSES.—For the most part the friends gathering at Upwey reside in furnished houses, which have to be taken for a fortnight at least. Those forming a house party generally divide the work and expense amongst themselves, and find this a most economical way of spending the holiday. The cost varies according to the household management and general arrangements, but usually runs from 25/ to 30/ per week for the fortnight. It is necessary for all accommodated in furnished houses to bring their own linen (bed and table) and cutlery, also a good rug.

BOARDING HOUSES.—Arrangements are also made with the local boarding houses at charges from £2/10/ to £3/3/ per week. One or two private boarding houses are also arranged for by the Convention Committee, where the charges are about 50/ per week.

ACCOMMODATION—Continued.

YOUNG MEN'S CAMP.—A Canvas Camp for young men is also provided on ground owned by the Convention Council in Collier Avenue, immediately facing the Church. Application for beds should be made early, but any having their own camp equipment can be accommodated at the last moment. The charge for use of camp stretcher, meals, etc., will be 25/ per week, or 4/6 per day. In every case the camper must supply his own bedding and cutlery.

DAY VISITORS

to the Convention are most cordially invited. It is hoped that arrangements can be made for Buses or Motors to leave Upwey after the evening meetings for either Ringwood railway station or the city direct. Tea is provided for those who desire a picnic lunch, or meals at some of the private or boarding houses can be obtained.

HYMN BOOKS.

Consecration and Faith Hymn Books will be used, and can be obtained by those who do not possess one at the Book Stall.
