

SITUATION.

UPWEY is 24 miles from Melbourne, situated midway between Ferntree Gully and Belgrave. It is a pretty township, a mile and a half from Upper Ferntree Gully Station, at the foot of the Dandenongs. It offers delightful bush and mountain walks, together with opportunities for splendid mountain climbing for the young people.

TRANSPORT.

RAILWAY SERVICE.—There is a good electric railway service to Upper Ferntree Gully. **Holiday Excursion Fares:** First Return, 3/10; second return, 2/11. **Day Single:** First, 2/5; second, 1/10. To this has to be added the Railway Bus fare from Ferntree Gully to Upwey—4d. each way. Some trains continue on the narrow gauge line to Upwey, and the fares are:—Holiday Excursion: First return, 4/2; second return, 3/3. Day Single: First, 2/6; second 1/11.

MOTOR SERVICE.—There is also a frequent service of motors from the city to Belgrave passing through Upwey. Moderate fares.

MEETINGS.

The Convention meetings are held on the Convention grounds, Collier Avenue, and will begin on Christmas Eve with a Preparatory Meeting at 8 p.m.

EARLY MORNING PRAYER MEETINGS are held every morning at 7 o'clock, including Sundays, commencing on Christmas Day.

MORNING BIBLE STUDIES will begin at **10.30 a.m. daily.**—Sundays excepted—to be followed by a second session, commencing shortly after 11.30 o'clock.

ACCOMMODATION.

FURNISHED HOUSES.—For the most part the friends gathering at Upwey reside in furnished houses, which are taken for either eleven days or a fortnight. Those forming a house party generally divide the work and expense amongst themselves, and find this a most economical way of spending the holiday. The cost varies according to the household management and general arrangements, but usually runs from £2 to £3 for the fortnight. It is necessary for all accommodated in furnished houses to bring their own linen (bed and table) and cutlery, also a good rug.

BOARDING HOUSES.—Arrangements ^{can be for} ~~are~~ also made ^{accommodation} with the local boarding houses, at charges from 35/- to ~~40/-~~ per week. ~~One or two private boarding houses are also arranged for by the Convention Committee, where the charges are about 50/- per week.~~

YOUNG MEN'S CAMP.—A Canvas Camp for young men is also provided on the Convention grounds. Application for beds should be made early, but any having their own camp equipment can be accommodated at the last moment. The charge for use of camp stretcher, meals, etc., will be 32/6 for ten days, December 24—January 3, covering the Convention meetings, or 4/6 per day for a few days. In every case the camper must supply his own bedding and cutlery.

DAY VISITORS

to the Convention are most cordially invited. Tea is provided on the ground for those who desire a picnic Lunch or Tea, or meals at some of the private or boarding houses can be obtained.

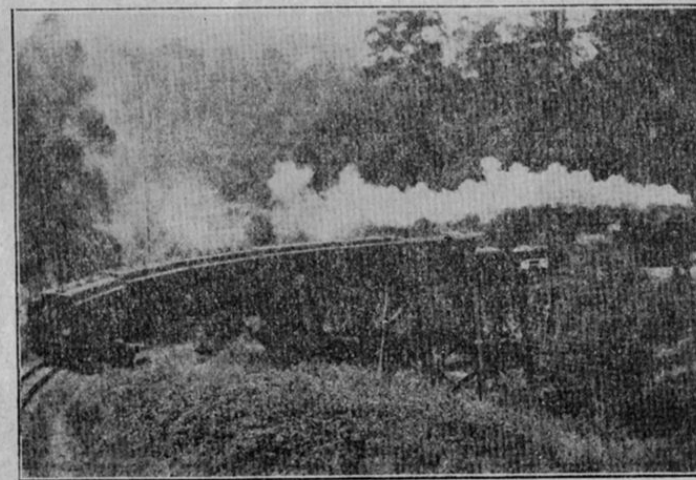
