

## SITUATION

UPWEY is 24 miles from Melbourne, situated midway between Ferntree Gully and Belgrave. It is a pretty township, a mile and a half from Upper Ferntree Gully Station, at the foot of the Dandenongs. It offers delightful bush and mountain walks, together with opportunities for splendid mountain climbing for the young people.

## TRANSPORT.

**RAILWAY SERVICE.**—There is a good electric railway service to **Upper Ferntree Gully**. **Holiday Excursion Fares:** Return, First Class, 3/2; Second, 2/5. First Single, 2/5; Second, 1/10. To these the Bus fare from the Gully to Upwey has to be added, 4d. each way.

Combined Rail and Bus Tickets are issued to **Upwey**. First return, 3/10; second return, 3/1. Day Single: First, 2/9 and Second 2/2.

Some trains run on the narrow-gauge railway to Upwey, where the fares are 1d cheaper than the combined Rail and Bus.

A special night train will leave Ferntree Gully Station for Melbourne at 10.31 p.m. (Sundays excepted), and the Bus connecting with this train leaves **Belgrave** at 10.8 p.m. and **Upwey** four minutes later. This train arrives at **Flinders Street** at 11.27 p.m.

**MOTOR SERVICE CARS.**—There is a frequent service of Motors from the City to Belgrave passing through Upwey. The fares are 3/- single, or 5/- day return.

## ACCOMMODATION.

**Applications for Accommodation** should be made as early as possible to the Hon. Secretary's Office, Keswick Book Depot, 315-317 Collins Street, Melbourne. The Accommodation Secretary will endeavor to be at the office each day during lunch time and also on Friday's till 8 p.m.

**\* FURNISHED HOUSES.**—For the most part the friends gathering at Upwey reside in furnished houses, which are taken for a fortnight. Those forming a house party generally divide the work and expense amongst themselves, and find this a most economical way of spending the holiday. It is necessary for each member of the party to bring their own linen (bed and table) and cutlery, also a good rug.

To secure a furnished house, whether taken direct from the agent or the owner or through the Convention Secretary, £1 deposit is necessary. For accommodation with a house party, taken through the Convention Secretary, 5/- deposit for each person.

Two sliding scales of **SUGGESTED CHARGES** for the house parties have been drawn up. "CLASS A" starts at 6/- per day for one or two days, 5/- for 5 days, 4/6 for 10 days, and 4/- per day for the full time. "CLASS B" starts at 5/- per day for one to three days, 4/- for 5 days, 3/6 for 10, and 3/- per day for the full time.

**BOARDING HOUSES.**—Arrangements can be made with the local boarding or guest houses at charges from 42/- to £3/3/- per week for the fortnight; or a minimum booking of £3/3/- for 10 days; 10/- deposit is necessary.

**YOUNG MEN'S CAMP.**—A Canvas Camp for young men is provided on the Convention grounds. Application for beds should be made early, but any having their own camp equipment can be accommodated at the last moment. The charge for use of camp stretcher, meals, etc., will be 4/- per day up to five days, 3/6 for six to eight days, or 3/- per day for nine days or more. In every case the camper must supply his own bedding and cutlery. Deposit, 5/- each.

## DAY VISITORS

to the Convention are most cordially invited. Tea or hot water is provided on the grounds for those who desire a Picnic Lunch or Tea, or meals at some of the private or boarding houses can be obtained.
