

SITUATION

Upwey is 24 miles from Melbourne, situated midway between Fern Tree Gully and Belgrave. It is a pretty township, a mile and a half from Upper Fern Tree Gully station, at the foot of the Dandenongs. It offers delightful bush and mountain walks, together with opportunities for splendid mountain climbing for the young people.

TRANSPORT

RAILWAY SERVICE.—There is good electric railway service to Upper Fern Tree Gully. **Holiday Excursion Fares:** Return, First Class, 3/2; Second, 2/5. First Single, 2/5; Second, 1/10. To these the bus fare from the Gully to Upwey has to be added, 4d. each way.

Combined Rail and Bus Tickets are issued to Upwey. First return, 3/10; Second return, 3/1. Day Single: First 2/9; and Second 2/2. Some trains run on the narrow-gauge railway to Upwey, where the fares are 1d. cheaper than the combined Rail and Bus.

A special night train will leave Fern Tree Gully station for Melbourne at 10.31 p.m. (Sundays excepted), and the Bus connecting with this train leaves Belgrave at 10.8 p.m., and Upwey four minutes later. This train arrives at Flinders Street at 11.27 p.m.

MOTOR SERVICE CARS—There is a frequent service of motors from the city to Belgrave, passing through Upwey. The Fares are 3/- Single or 5/- Day Return.

MEETINGS

ACCOMMODATION

There is plenty of accommodation available for visitors to Upwey in the form of (1) **Furnished Houses**, for families and private house-parties; (2) **Boarding Houses**; (3) (very rarely) a **Furnished Room** in a private house; and (4) **Paying Guest Accommodation**, with Convention friends for a limited number.

FURNISHED HOUSES.—It is recommended that these be obtained direct from the local house agents by those desiring them. It will be found that all houses must be booked for a full fortnight; and for this accommodation it is necessary to supply own linen, cutlery, and a rug. A visit of inspection is generally desirable, but interstate visitors and others who cannot manage this are advised to state their exact requirements (as nearly as they are able) to the Convention Secretary, who will gladly endeavour to secure a house suitable. This will necessitate payment of a **Booking Fee** of 2/6, as well as the £1 deposit for each house booked.

The cost for each person in a private house-party varies considerably, according to (1) rent of house, (2) the number of those forming the house-party, and (3) the catering provided by the house-mother. But this is entirely a private matter for the house-party to determine. It is merely suggested here that a friend occupying a bed in the house-party for a few days only should, in all fairness, contribute a considerably higher price per day than those staying all the time.

BOARDING HOUSES.—There are three or four local boarding houses to which the Secretary will be glad to direct those preferring this. The charges will probably be £2/10/- to £3/3/- per week for the holiday season, with a minimum booking of ten days.

PAYING GUEST ACCOMMODATION with Convention friends will also probably be available for a limited number. Those being thus accommodated will possibly need to bring blankets as well as linen and cutlery, and be ready to assist the house-mother in light duties if necessary. A **Booking Fee** of 2/6 each person will be charged by the office, apart from the cost of accommodation.

DAY VISITORS

to the Convention are most cordially invited. Tea or hot water is provided on the grounds for those who desire a Picnic Lunch or Tea, or meals at some of the private or boarding houses can be obtained.

HYMN BOOKS

Consecration and Faith Hymn Books will be used, and can be obtained by those who do not possess one at the Book Stall on the Grounds.
