

SITUATION.

Upwey is 24 miles from Melbourne, situated midway between Fern Tree Gully and Belgrave. It is a pretty township, a mile and a half from Upper Fern Tree Gully station, at the foot of the Dandenongs. It offers delightful bush and mountain walks, together with opportunities for splendid mountain climbing for the young people.

TRANSPORT.

RAILWAY SERVICE.—There is good electric railway service to **Upper Fern Tree Gully**. **Fares:** Day or Month Return, First Class, 3/2; Second, 2/5. First Single, 2/5; Second, 1/10. To these the bus fare from the Gully to Upwey has to be added, 4d. each way.

Some trains run on the narrow-gauge railway to Upwey, where the fares are cheaper than the Rail and Bus.

The last bus, connecting with the electric train at Upper Fern Tree Gully, leaves **Upwey** (Sundays excepted) at 10.12 p.m., and arrives at **Flinders Street** at 11.27 p.m. On Sundays the last bus leaves Upwey at 9.49 p.m.

SPECIAL BUS.—On Tuesday, December 24, and on all main holidays, a special bus will run from the Keswick Book Depot to the Convention. **Fares.** 3/- Single, 5/- Return. Seats must be booked beforehand by ringing Mrs. J. Harmer, WA 4184.

LUGGAGE.—Arrangements are made with a carrier to transport luggage to Upwey if left at Keswick Book Depot on or before Saturday, December 21. Luggage must be clearly labelled and the cost will be 1/- per piece.

MEETINGS.

The Convention meetings will be held in the Hall on the Convention grounds, Collier Avenue, beginning on Tuesday, December 24, with the first meeting at 8 p.m., and concluding on Sunday, January 5.

EARLY MORNING PRAYER MEETINGS daily from 7 to 8 o'clock, including Sundays, commencing on the 25th.

There will be meetings on all week days at 10.30 a.m. and 7.30 p.m.

The **MORNING MEETINGS** (Sunday excepted) will commence with a Bible Reading and conclude with a Convention message by a second speaker.

NO AFTERNOON MEETINGS excepting—

BOXING DAY (Thursday, December 26)—3 p.m.

MISSIONARY DAY (Tuesday, December 31)—3 p.m.

NEW YEAR'S DAY (Wednesday, January 1)—3 p.m.

AND ON SUNDAYS—3 p.m.

The **EVENING MEETINGS** will have a Convention message each day—excepting on

MISSIONARY DAY (Annual Missionary Meeting), and

SUNDAYS, December 29 and January 5 (Gospel Meetings).

SUNDAY MORNINGS—Meetings at 11 a.m.

SUNDAY AFTERNOONS—Young People's Meetings, 3 p.m.

CHILDREN'S MEETINGS will be held in the Union Church on Week Days at 10.30 a.m., and on Sundays at 2.45 p.m.

ACCOMMODATION.

Accommodation is arranged for visitors to Upwey in the form of (1) **Furnished Houses**, (2) **Boarding Houses**, (3) **Convention House Parties**, (4) **Men's and Ladies Camps**, and (5) **Furnished Room** in private house.

FURNISHED HOUSES.—It is recommended that these be obtained, if possible, direct from the local house agents at Upwey. They must be booked, generally, for the full fortnight, and are secured by a deposit of £1. House linen and cutlery are not provided. A visit of inspection is generally desirable, but country visitors and others who cannot manage this, are advised to communicate their requirements to the Assistant Secretary, who will gladly endeavour to secure a house suitable.

BOARDING HOUSES.—There is a limited amount of boarding house accommodation for those preferring this. Charges range from £2/10/- to £4/4/- per week, with a minimum booking of ten days.

CONVENTION HOUSE PARTIES.—A limited amount of accommodation will also be available with Convention friends in house parties, costing approximately 7/- down to 5/6 per day, **according to length of stay**, or £3/3/- for the full fortnight. Friends being thus accommodated will need to bring a rug and blanket, bed linen and cutlery (clearly marked), and be prepared to assist the House-mother with light duties when necessary.

NOTE.—The cost for each person in a Convention House-party varies considerably, according to (1) rent of house, (2) the number of those forming the house-party, and (3) the catering provided by the House-mother. But this is entirely a matter for each house leader to determine. It is merely suggested here that a friend occupying a bed for a few days only, should, in all fairness, contribute a considerably higher price per day than those staying all the time.

CAMPS.—These will be under canvass on the Convention grounds. The charge will be about 5/- per day, and campers will need to bring own blankets, and cutlery, etc.

A BOOKING FEE of 2/6 per person is charged for making accommodation arrangements. Kindly give names and addresses of each member of party booking, and also expected dates of arrival and departure.

DAY VISITORS

to the Convention are most cordially invited. Tea or hot water is provided on the grounds for those who desire a Picnic Lunch or Tea. Meals can also be obtained at local cafes and at some of the private or boarding houses.

Casual visitors desiring to stay one night can generally be accommodated, but it is important that these **bring their own bed linen and a rug**.

HYMN BOOKS.

Consecration and Faith Hymn Books will be used, and can be obtained by those who do not possess one, at the Book Stall on the Grounds.

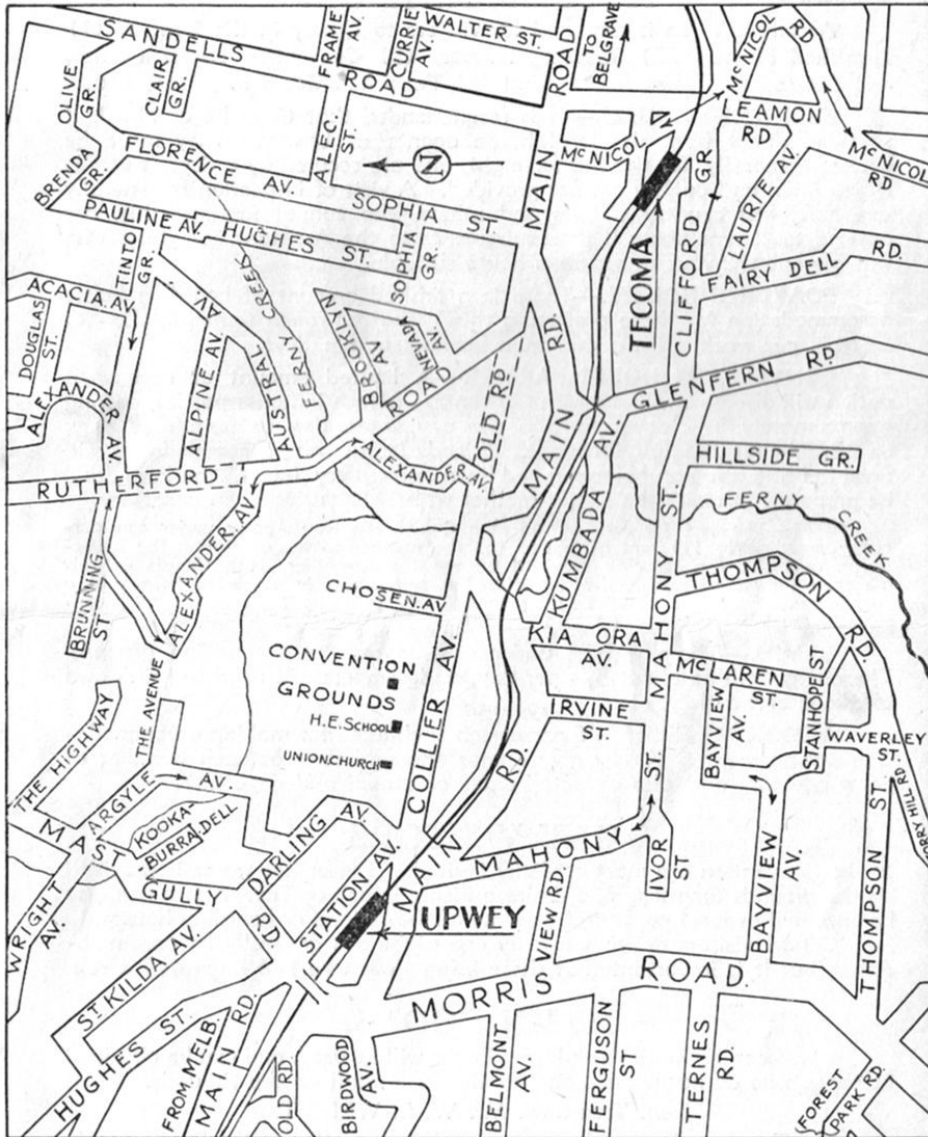
