

The Upwey Convention

—An Australian "KESWICK" or Victorious Life gathering —has been held at Upwey for 32 years to enable members of all branches of the Christian Church to spend the holiday season in fellowship over the Word of God. Owing to the Government resuming the former property at Upwey for school extensions, the Convention was moved in 1950 to

to a new 22-acre site—four miles further into the Dandenongs—28 miles from Melbourne. The new Convention grounds, formerly used as a golf links, are set in ideal surroundings, so that those attending may enjoy the twofold blessings of Christian fellowship and exquisite scenery. There are delightful walks leading through fern gullies and bush tracks to Mt. Morton, to the south, whilst the Sherbrooke Forest, Emerald Lake, and many other beauty spots of the Dandenongs are easily reached for picnic parties on free afternoons.

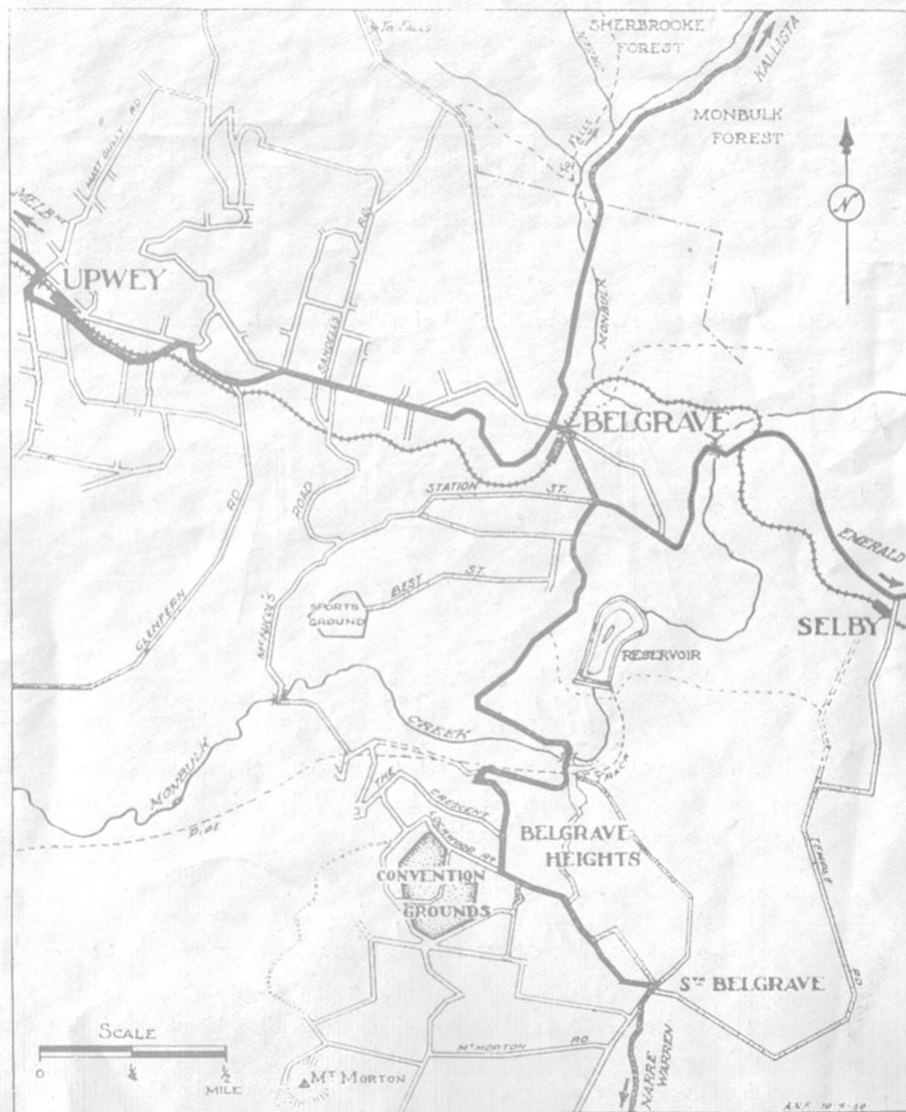
Travel Directions

TRAIN from Flinders Street Station to Upper Fern Tree Gully, thence by bus to Belgrave Heights.

Total Train and Bus Fares: Single: 1st, 4/11; 2nd, 4/1. Return: 1st, 7/3; 2nd, 6/2. Weekly periodicals and Sunday excursion fares are at much cheaper rates. Special Buses will run from Belgrave to Belgrave Heights and back to suit Convention Meetings. Fare, 7d.

The last Bus will leave Belgrave Heights at 9.20 p.m. to connect with a train which arrives at Flinders Street at 11.27 p.m. (week days), and 11.4 p.m. (Sundays).

MOTORISTS should take the main road to Belgrave, turn right across railway bridge, and sign posts then lead clearly to Belgrave Heights, 2½ miles beyond.
