

The Convention Site

In a beautiful setting on the Convention's 20-acre property in the Dandenong Mountains, is an auditorium to accommodate up to 1500 visitors.

Belgrave Heights is 28 miles from Melbourne and may be reached by Electric Train and Bus. There are delightful walks through ferny gullies and bush tracks to Mt. Morton. Nearby are the beautiful scenic drives for which the Dandenongs are famous. This will be the third year that the Convention, formerly held at Upwey, has been held on the new site.

DAY VISITORS

to the Convention are most cordially invited. Tea or hot water is provided on the grounds for preparing a picnic lunch or tea. Meals can be obtained in a Cafe in the township.

The evening Meeting will close at 8.30 p.m. to allow visitors to return to the City in good time.

Stretchers and mattresses are available for hire, also a limited number of tents.

ACCOMMODATION

is arranged for those desiring to stay in the district for the Convention, in Furnished Houses, for families and larger parties; at Boarding Houses, and also in Camps for young people. Communal Kitchens for large or small groups prepared for camping are available on the Convention grounds; also Camp Sites for those bringing their own equipment.

It is recommended that furnished houses be obtained, if possible, direct from the local house agents at Belgrave. A visit of inspection is generally desirable, but country visitors and others who cannot arrange this may communicate their requirements to the Secretary, who will gladly endeavour to secure a suitable house, or make whatever arrangements are desired.

About the Convention Speakers

Rev. F. W. Dixon, Minister of Lansdowne Baptist Church, England. Ministers to a large church, 11,000 receive his weekly Bible Study Notes, spoke at English Keswick Convention last year.

Rev. C. H. Nash, beloved for his long years of ministry in the Melbourne Bible Institute and throughout Australia.

Dr. Leland Wang, Founder of Chinese Foreign Missionary Union, a widely honoured and esteemed Chinese Christian leader.

Dr. Leon Morris, Vice-Principal of Ridley Theological College, Melbourne, recently returned from a period of study in Cambridge University, England.

Rev. G. H. Morling, loved Principal of Baptist Theological College of N.S.W., whose ministry is always welcomed on the Convention platform.

Mr. Bruce Lumsden, widely known for his work among youth, who will lead the C.S.S.M. team which in past years has made an invaluable contribution to the Convention.

Rev. Ivor Powell, internationally known Welsh Evangelist, who has been engaged in evangelistic work with the Baptist Church of Australia.

Two other speakers whose photographs are unfortunately not yet available are **Rev. David Clarnette, L.Th.**, Minister of Northcote Methodist Church and **Rev. J. E. Hull, M.A.**, Minister of the Glen Iris Methodist Church, both of whom will be new voices at the Convention and **Mr. A. S. EGGLESTON, F.R.A.I.A.**, of Melbourne.

About the Convention Message

This has been admirably summed up in the words of Dr. W. Graham Scroggie:

"The Keswick Movement exists to expound and exemplify the Christian life on the top level. It is not an evangelistic movement, though it is soundly evangelical.

Its main attention is given, not to effects, but to causes, and to causes with a view to effects.

Its chief concern is not so much with the extent of the Church's work as with the depth of the Church's life.

Keswick's primary mission is to the Church and not to be "world . . . Consequently the emphasis of its message is not on the Saviourship of Christ, but on His Lordship; not upon service but upon character; not upon organisation, but upon the Holy Spirit."

TRAVEL DIRECTIONS

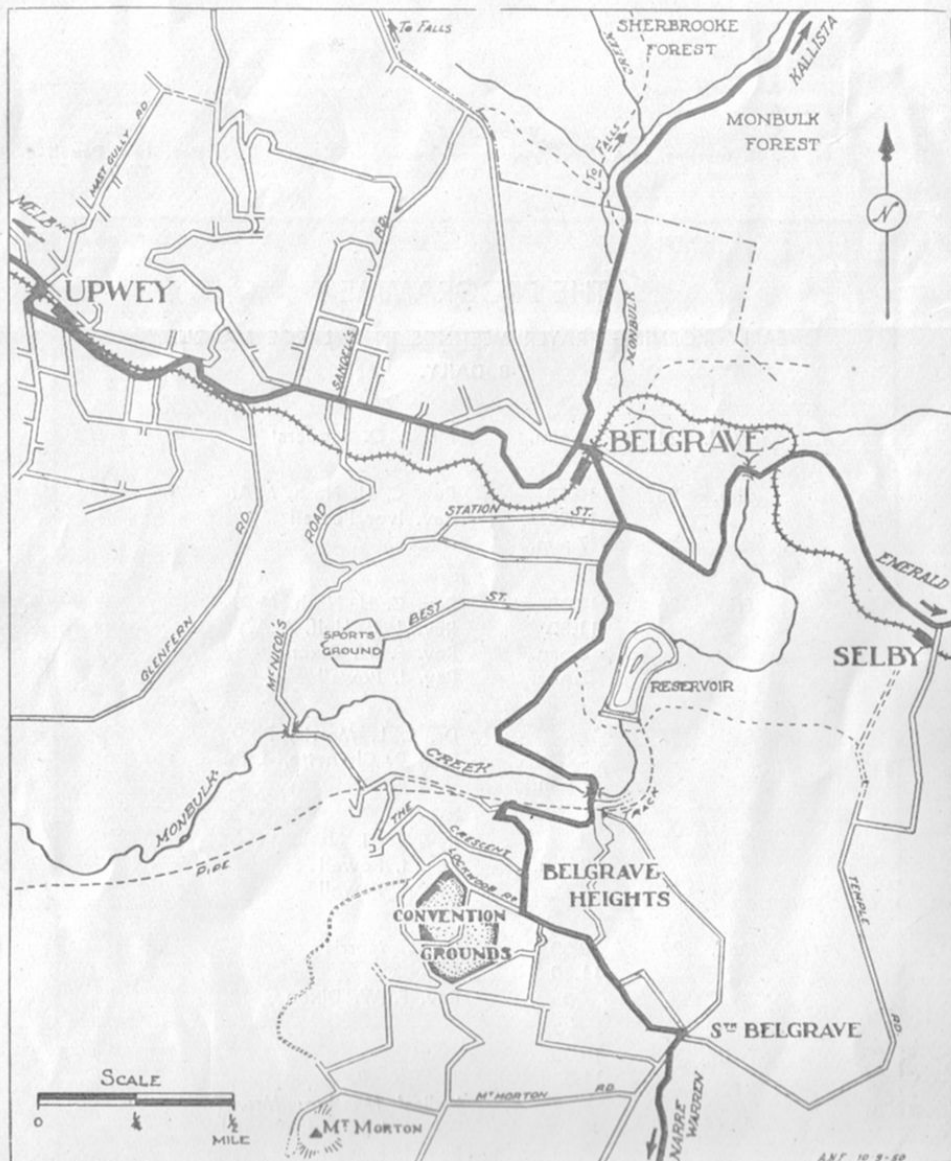
Take the train from Flinders St. Station to Upper Ferntree Gulley, thence by bus to Belgrave Heights.
