Rev. J. W. Searle, the esteemed Principal of the Melbourne Bible Institute, is well known for his practical Bible teaching ministry.

Captain J. C. Metcalfe comes from England for four months' ministry in Australia and New Zealand. He is the Editor of "The Overcomer," and has campaigned extensively in U.S.A. as well as throughout the British Isles. In 1950 he was co-speaker with Canon Marcus Loane at "Keswick" in Kenya.

Major Leonard Moules, a missionary of the World-wide Evangelization Crusade, has been on "active service" for many years on the Indo-Tibetan Border. He has just completed an extensive missionary survey of fifteen States of Central India.

Rev. Dr. A. Cyril Cato, closely associated with the Convention twenty years ago, prior to proceeding to Methodist Overseas Missionary service in Fiji, now returns from his Methodist Church at Adamstown, N.S.W.

Rev. Graham R. Delbridge is speaking at the Convention for the first time. Formerly Chaplain of the Youth Department of the Diocese of Sydney, he is now Rector of Holy Trinity Church, North Adelaide.

Principal G. H. Morling, the Head of the New South Wales Baptist College, has been a frequent visitor to the Convention for more than twenty years. Always an acceptable speaker, he will be warmly welcomed by old friends and new.

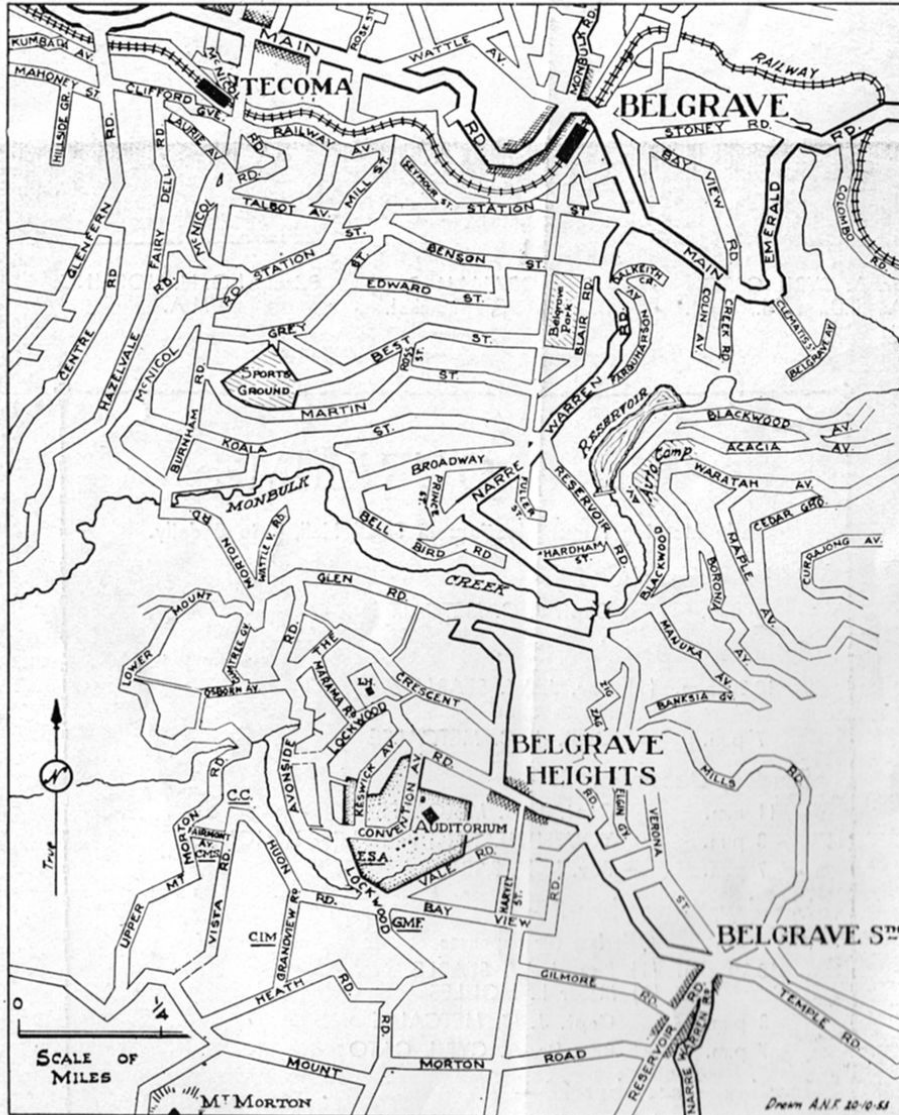


## Travel Directions

**TRAIN** from Flinders Street Station to Fern Tree Gully, thence by Bus to Belgrave Heights.

**MOTORISTS** take main roads to Belgrave, turn right across the new railway bridge, and sign posts then lead clearly to Belgrave Heights, 2½ miles beyond.

**SPECIAL BUSES** will run from the city right to the Convention on the three public holidays (Dec. 27, and Jan. 1 and 3). The day return fare is 10/-, and bookings should be made early at the Convention Office, M 1526 (MB 5581 after November).
