... at the popular Convention Centre, studded with gum-trees, pines and ornamental shrubs, only 28 miles east of Melbourne. In the large Auditorium, which accommodates 1500 visitors, you may gather with members of all branches of the Christian Church in fellowship over the Word of God. There are delightful walks through bush tracks and fern gullies to Mt. Morton near by, whilst the Sherbrooke Forest, Emerald Lake, and many other beauty spots of the Dandenongs are easily reached by car or bus.

ACCOMMODATION

will be arranged where possible for those desiring to stay in the district for the Convention, in furnished houses for families and larger parties; at boarding houses, and also in camps for young people. Communal kitchens for large or small groups prepared for camping are available on the Convention grounds, and there are good camp sites for those bringing their own equipment.

DAY VISITORS

to the Convention are most cordially invited. Tea or hot water is provided on the grounds for preparing a picnic lunch or tea. Meals can be obtained at a cafe in the township. The evening meeting will close at 8.30 to allow visitors to return to the city in good time.

CONVENTION HYMNS

selected from the Keswick Hymn Book are provided for visitors. The complete Hymn Book, together with music, can be obtained, if desired, at the bookstall on the Grounds. All the main meetings will be preceded by fifteen minutes of bright singing.

CHILDREN'S MEETINGS

will be held daily in the Small Hall, under the well-known red and white banner of the Children's Special Service Mission. With **Mr. David Uren** leading the team, a complete C.S.S.M. programme, including Keenite classes, games, competitions, and special activities for early 'Teen-agers will be provided. Morning sessions, 10 o'clock (Keenites), and 11.30.

The very young children will be cared for at a **Creche**, conducted separately on the Grounds, thus enabling mothers to attend the morning and afternoon Convention meetings with greater freedom.

Bishop A. Stanway, of Tanganyika, was closely linked with the Convention as a leader in C.M.S. League of Youth Camps before proceeding to Africa over twenty years ago. He often ministers at "Keswick" conventions on the mission field, and will speak at Belgrave Heights for the second time.

Mr. J. Oswald Sanders, the General Director of the China Inland Mission, is well known as the Chairman for several years of Belgrave Heights Conventions. His ministry, always most helpful, will be warmly welcomed after an absence of three years.

Rev. H. J. Whitney, a Presbyterian minister of Queensland, with a special call to evangelism, will be speaking at the Convention for the second time. He has been campaigning in U.S.A. for several months this year.

Mr. F. I. Andersen, a Staff Lecturer at Ridley College, Melbourne, is well known as an experienced youth leader in the Inter-Varsity Fellowship and at Belgrave Heights Easter Conventions. He will share the Morning Bible Readings with Mr. Sanders.

Rev. Dr. A. Cyril Cato, closely associated with the Convention before proceeding to missionary service in Fiji, is the minister of the Methodist Church at Adamstown, N.S.W. His stirring messages at Belgrave Heights two years ago were richly blessed.

Other speakers included in the programme are: **Rev. E. C. Smith**, the minister of the Aberdeen Street Baptist Church, Geelong, and **Mrs. J. O. Sanders**, who will address a special meeting for ladies. **Mr. David Uren**, C.S.S.M. Staff Worker, will again lead the Children's Meetings.

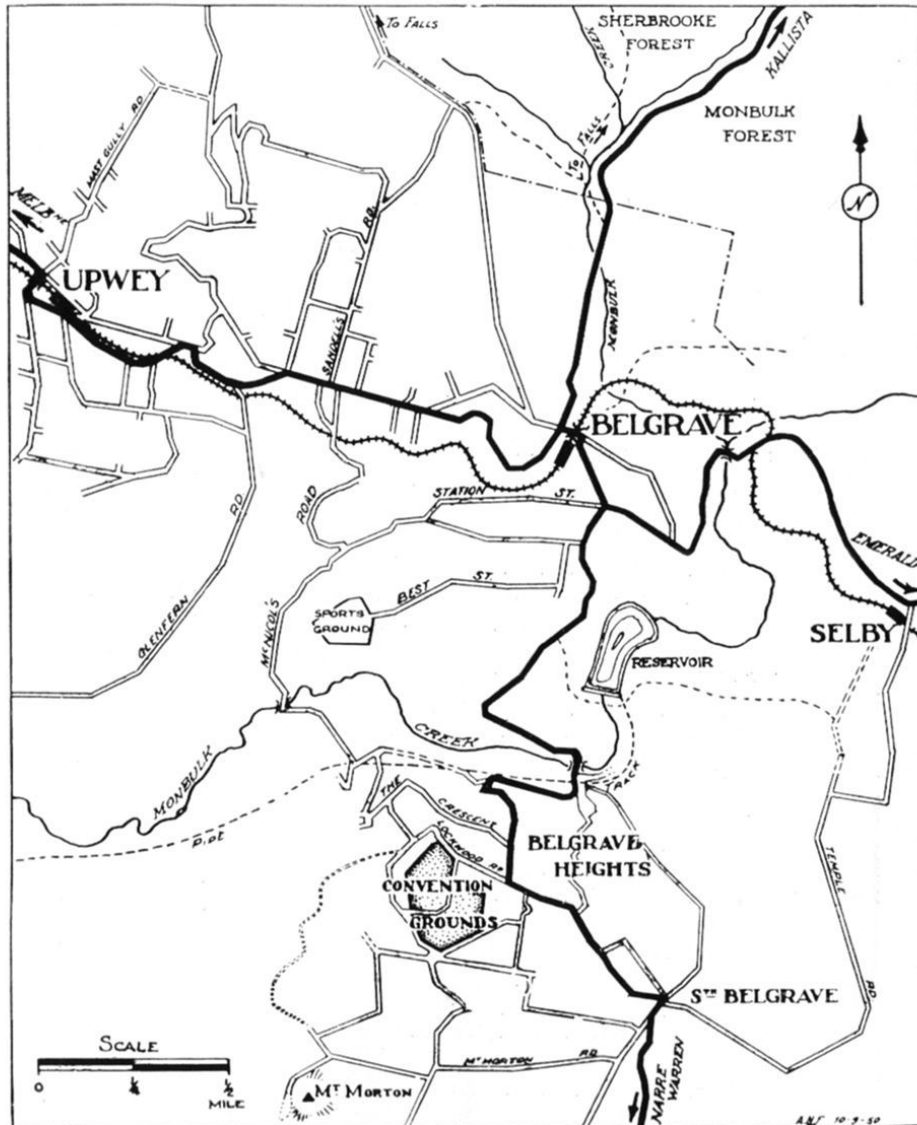

Travel Directions

TRAIN from Flinders Street Station to Fern Tree Gully, thence by Bus to Belgrave Heights. Buses leave after all evening meetings.

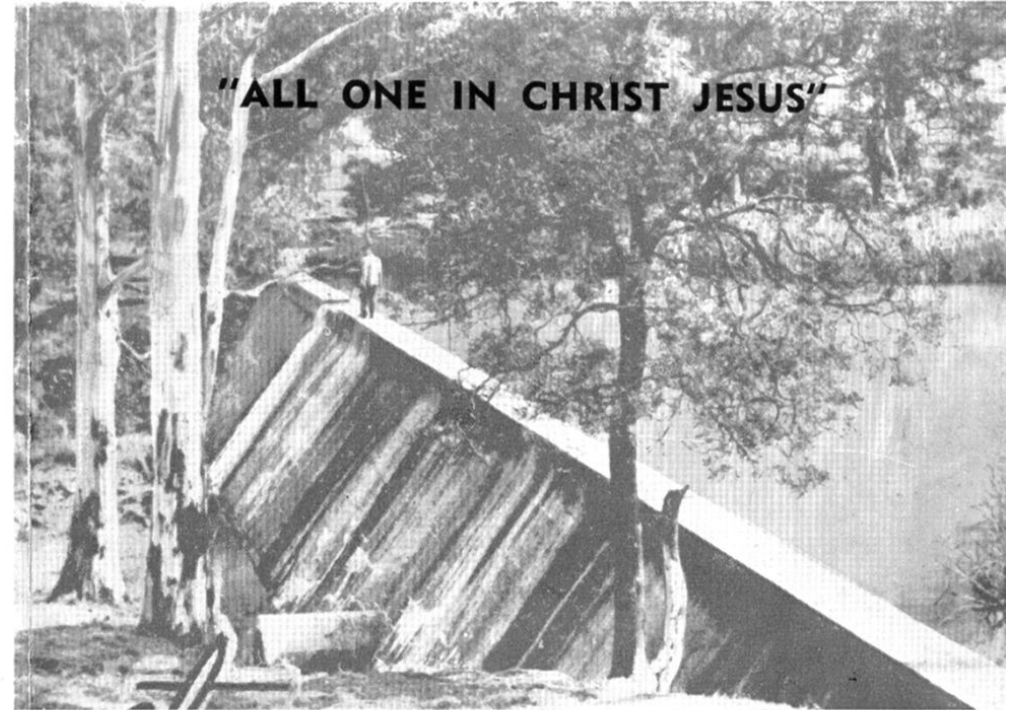
MOTORISTS take main roads to Belgrave, turn right across bridge over railway, and signposts then lead clearly to Belgrave Heights, 2½ miles beyond. An alternative route is to turn right into McNicol Road at Tecoma, and arrow signs lead to Belgrave Heights, two miles ahead.

SPECIAL BUSES will also run direct from the city right to the Convention on three main holidays (Dec. 26 and 29, and Jan. 1). The day return fare is 10/-, and bookings should be made early at the Convention Office, MB 5581.
