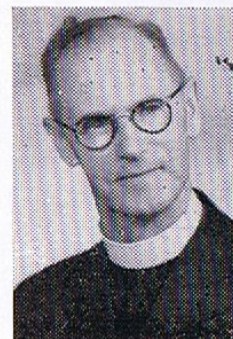


## Hear These Gifted Speakers

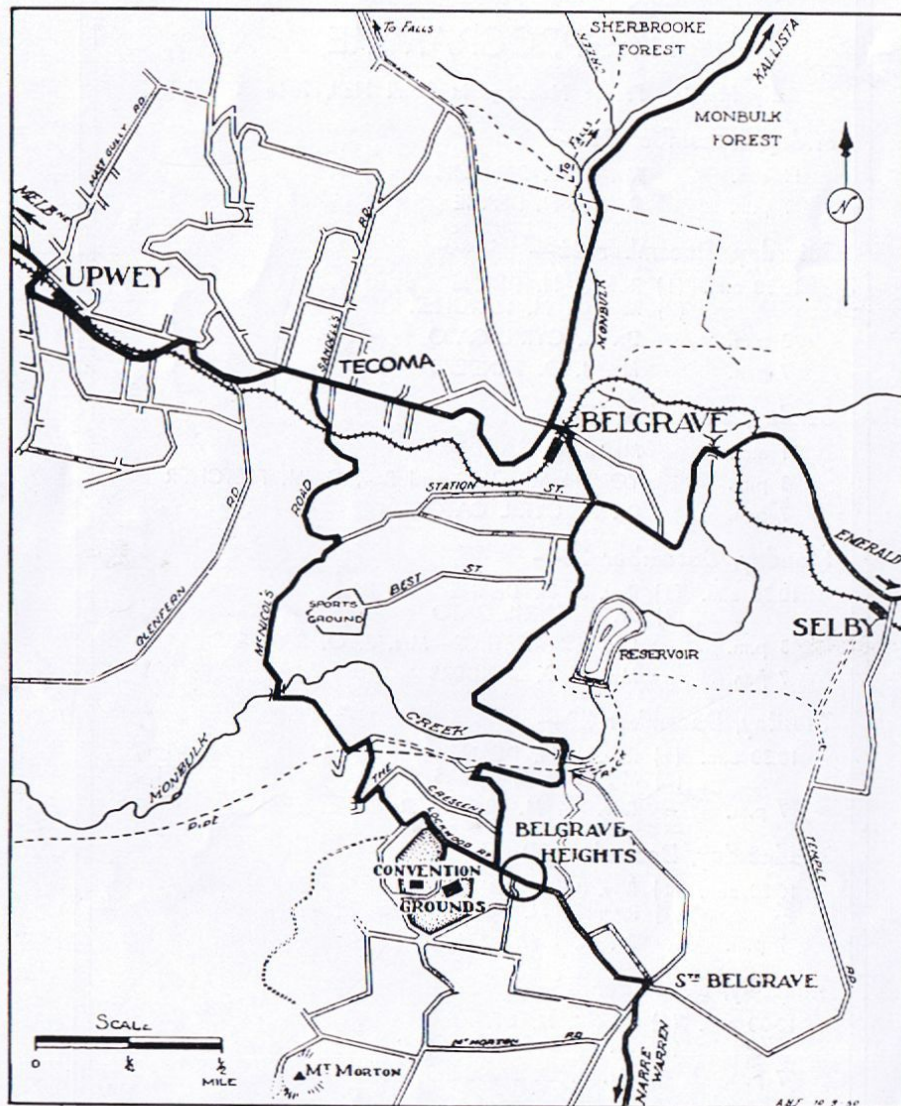


## Travel Directions

**TRAIN** from Flinders Street Station to Fern Tree Gully, thence by Bus to Belgrave Heights. Buses leave after all evening meetings.

**MOTORISTS** take main roads to Belgrave, turn right across bridge over railway, and signposts then lead clearly to Belgrave Heights, 2½ miles beyond. An alternative route is to turn right into McNicol Road, at Tecoma, and arrow signs lead to Belgrave Heights, two miles ahead.

**SPECIAL BUSES** will also run direct from the city right to the Convention on three main days (Dec. 26 and Jan. 1 and 2). The day return fare is 10/-, and bookings should be made early at the Convention Office, MB 2777.
