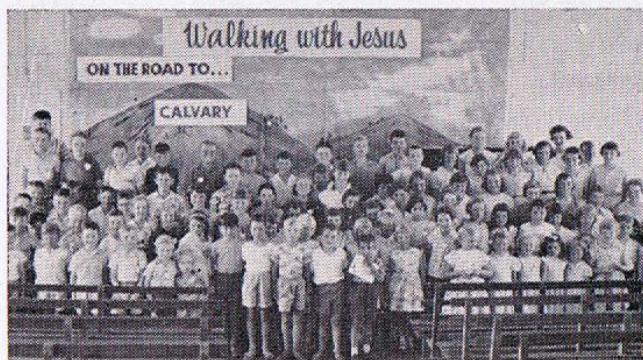


# Where Great Vacations Come True!

There are kitchens on the grounds for large or small groups prepared for camping, and good camp sites, with well-equipped facilities, can be booked by those bringing their own caravans and tents. Electricity supply for caravans can be reserved.

### Day Visitors

Day visitors to the Convention are most cordially invited. Boiling water is provided on the grounds for preparing picnic lunches, and cups of tea, and light refreshments can also be obtained at the Canteen. The evening meetings will end at 8.30 to enable visitors to return to the city in good time.

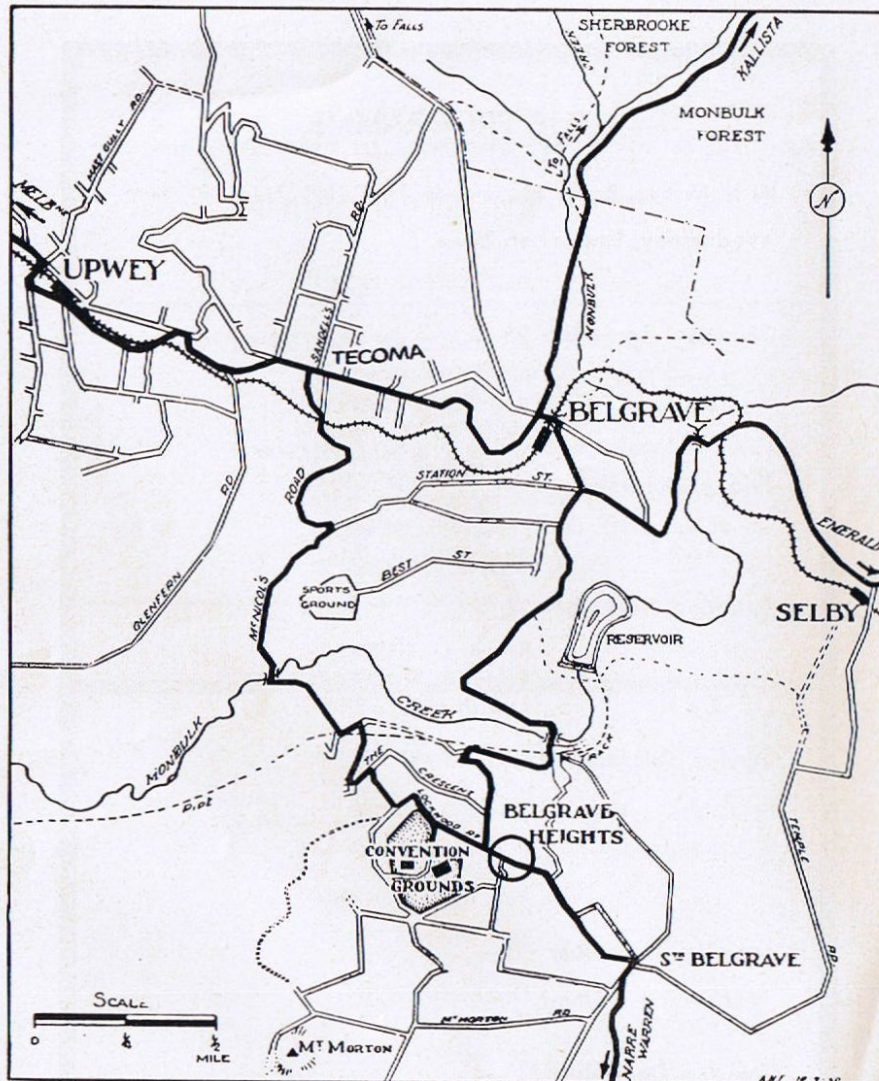


## Travel Directions

**TRAIN** from Flinders Street Station to Belgrave, thence by Bus to Belgrave Heights.

**MOTORISTS** take main roads to Belgrave, turn right across bridge over railway, and signposts then lead clearly to Belgrave Heights, 2½ miles beyond. An alternative route is to turn right into McNicol Road, at Tecoma, and arrow signs lead to Belgrave Heights, two miles ahead.

**SPECIAL BUSES** will also run direct from the city right to the Convention on three main days (December 26 and 31, and January 1). The day return fare is 10/-, and bookings should be made early at the Convention office, 62-2777.
