GENERAL INFORMATION

PRAYFR

Prayer meetings will be held in the Warratah Room in the back stage area (follow the signs), each day at **9:00am** (**8:30am** Monday). You are encouraged to attend so that together we can seek the blessing of the Lord upon the ministry of the Word and all that is done in His name.

CRÈCHE

During the daytime main sessions, crèche facilities are provided in the playcentre just beyond the kiosk refreshment and picnic area. The crèche is for children and toddlers up to 4 years old. Parents using this facility will be rostered on to help and will need to show their WCC. Please note that outside meeting times the crèche equipment may be used with adult supervision. Crèche check-in is outside the crèche area.

PRIMARY AGED CHILDREN (5 TO 12 YO)

OAC ministries will be running a program in the Small Hall. Parents: it is important that you collect your children immediately following the conclusion of the auditorium meetings.

TEENAGERS

You are invited to the Recreation Hall for a program each day at the same time as the day meetings in the auditorium. This program will be run by **Andrew Fisher** (Ministry Manger) and guests with some help from students at Capernwray College.

YOUNG ADULTS

A Young Adult (18+) program will be held in Recreation Hall after the end of the evening session.

RECORDINGS OF SPEAKERS

CDs and MP3s of all messages will be available for purchase during the Convention from the booth in the foyer. Recordings are produced by volunteers and all proceeds go to the Convention. Please use these resources as a gift or in Bible studies. Please respect the copyright that applies (see p40).

RNNKSHNPS

Two bookshops will be open each day in the foyer with a range of Bibles, Books, music, etc. One is from **Koorong** stock and the other is 2nd hand books from **New Life Christian Books**. See bookshops' sign for opening times.

GLOBAL MISSIONS DISPLAYS

Spend time at the **Global Missions Displays** in the Auditorium where a number of Missions are represented. Visual displays and other informative material will stimulate your missions interest, and representatives from the Missions will be on hand to talk with you.

KINSK

Refreshments such as cold drinks, ice creams, snacks and take-away food are available at the kiosk. Beat the queue – preorder your lunch. Closed during meetings.

CAFÉ

Get your barista coffee, hot drinks and tasty snacks at the cafe in the foyer. Closed during meetings.

KIOSK AND CAFÉ SERVICE TIMES

MEALS IN DINING ROOM

Meals are ONLY available for those staying in the Hope Centre and those who have pre-purchased Dining Room Meals from the website. Check with the foyer desk for more information.

SHUTTLE BUS

A shuttle bus service between Belgrave station and the Convention is available. Generally this service operates half an hour

before main sessions and after as required. Please call the office (9752 6855) at least 10mins before arrival at the Belgrave Station.

SPEED LIMIT

The maximum driving speed on Convention Ave and the Convention property is **no more than 10 kph.** Particular care is to be exercised in the camping areas.

PARKING

Day Visitors – Parking is available on the Convention grounds and/or the Convention Lodge. To maintain good relations with the neighbours DO NOT park in the street outside Convention property.

Staying On-Site – If you have a second car, do not park it in the Day Visitor Car Park. Park at the Convention Lodge car park (see map page 6 – Lockwood Road).

DISABLED ACCESS

Vehicle access for disabled drop-off is located next to the auditorium on the left of Convention Avenue for drivers with disabled passengers. **This is not a parking space**, but cars can be parked across the road.

FIRST AID

First Aid assistance is available at the foyer office. First Aid is located in the Prayer Room next to the Kiosk. Contact **9752 6855** if assistance is required.

BABY CHANGE FACILITY

Located in the Auditorium disabled facilities.

SECURITY

It is advisable to take security precautions at your accommodation and to lock your cars.

ALCOHOL AND DRUGS

The convention is an alcohol and drug free area.

CAMP FIRE AND WOOD FUELLED BARBECUES

Camp fires in the open are prohibited other than in a designated fire pit or BBQ areas (No fires on Total Fire Ban days). Arrange at Reception.

EMERGENCY ASSEMBLY AREAS

In the event of an **internal fire emergency**, the assembly point is the grass area on the south side of the car park, near the Small Hall. In the event of an **external fire emergency**, the assembly point is the Main Auditorium. If such a situation arises you will be advised over the public address system.

The Convention Office (in the foyer) is open for your convenience right through the Convention from 9am until 7pm EXCEPT during the meetings. Our office staff will be pleased to assist you with any enquiries.

In the event of an after hours emergency only, please contact the Property Manager.







EASTER 2024 MINISTRY & FINANCIAL UPDATE

We entered a new era of **opportunity** for Convention ministry in 2024.

Like all opportunities ours needs to make the transition from concept to reality. A new building needs to move from a completed but empty one, to a site buzzing with activity. Our ministry dreams need to move from ideas/visions to Conventions happening, with people expectantly attending to hear God speak to them.

The 'Hope Centre' is completed and is in operation. To enable our guests to enjoy their stay, we are working on completing the landscaping and constructing recreation facilities. Unfortunately, the recent storms in Belgrave were severe and the clean-up has temporarily slowed progress on these activities.

We are very keen to see the usage of the 'Hope Centre' build up to sustainable levels in the near future. We are wanting this period to be as short as possible to minimise our financial obligations. You can help introduce us to those organising conferences, church camps. leaders' retreats, and school camps. Encourage these people to come and see the facilities as most people who see their high standard are keen to book them.
